The Legal Aid Board has no current plans to disclose any more revealing data on such cases. This is because the client is referred to the Legal Aid Board as part of a wider process in which they have (allegedly) experienced a violation of their person/ are going to be subject to an examination of their sexual history. It is therefore not appropriate to seek further data at that time relative to the service the Legal Aid Board offers the client in the process. The Legal Aid Board also has no immediate business need for such additional data. Therefore, non-collection/publication of any additional data is in keeping with the GDPR principle of necessary collection.

Case outcome data are matters for the Courts Service or the Director of Public Prosecutions.
